remap Purpose Marks a range of blocks as unusable on the disk and relocates any data allocated in that range.

*

remap Command

The remap command only relocates blocks. It does not correct or repair blocks that contain corrupted contents. The command uses a physical block size based on the disk group attribute. SECTOR_SIZE Purpose Repairs a range of physical blocks on a disk. The remap command only repairs blocks that have read disk I/O errors. It does not repair blocks that contain corrupted contents, whether or not those blocks can be read. The command assumes

a physical block size of 512 bytes and supports all allocation unit sizes (1 to 64 MB).

Gets and displays environment variables and their values from the Oracle Restart configuration for a database, listener, or Oracle ASM instance.

srvctl getenv Summary

Command Description

srvctl getenv asm Displays the configured environment variables for the Oracle ASM instance
