Describe the meaning of the term pulse as it relates to the cardiovascular system and explain where a pulse could be palpated.

A. The pulse is what is felt when the left ventricle contracts and sends a wave of blood through the arteries. It can be palpated anywhere an artery simultaneously passes near the skin's surface.

#### SIMULATION

Shock is also called hypoperfusion. Identify the meaning of inadequate circulation as it relates to shock.

A. Shock or inadequate circulation is a state of profound depression of the vital processes of the body. It is characterized by signs and symptoms such as pallor; cyanosis; cool, clammy skin; rapid, weak pulse; rapid, shallow breathing; restlessness, anxiety, or mental dullness; nausea and vomiting; reduction in the total blood volume; and hypotension.

What is the effect of dopamine at high doses (10?0 mcg/kg/min)?

A. Vasopressor dose Alpha-adrenergic effect causing peripheral arterial and venous vasoconstriction. Used to treat low blood pressure and shock.

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If while ventilating a patient the chest does not rise and fall, what should you do after repositioning fingers and mask?
