ASVAB Section Eight : Paragraph comprehension

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QUESTION 1

High-school and college graduates attempting to find jobs should participate in mock job interviews. These mock interviews help students prepare for the types of questions they'll be asked, make them more comfortable with common interview formats, and help them critique their performance before facing a real interviewer. Because they're such a valuable aid, schools should organize mock job interviews for all of their graduating students.

The above passage states that mock job interviews _____.

- A. frighten students
- B. should be offered to the best students
- C. help prepare students for real job interviews
- D. should be organized by students

Correct Answer: C

Explanation:

The passage doesn't say anything about mock job interviews being frightening, so Choice "frighten students" is wrong.

The passage says that mock job interviews should be available to all students, so Choice "should be offered to the best students" is wrong.

The passage says that schools, not students, should organize mock interviews, so Choice "should be organized by students" is incorrect.

QUESTION 2

The idea being an alarming one, he scrambled out of bed and groped his way to the window. He was obliged to rub the frost off with the sleeve of his dressing-gown before he could see anything and could see very little then. All he could make out was that it was still very foggy and extremely cold and that there was no noise of people running to and fro and making a great stir, as there unquestionably would've been if night had beaten off bright day, and taken possession of the world.

This story takes place _____.

- A. in England
- B. on a calm summer evening
- C. on a winter night
- D. in England on a winter night

Correct Answer: C



Explanation:

The passage doesn't state the locale of the story, so Choices "in England" and "in England on a winter night" are incorrect.

The references to extreme cold and lack of light makes Choice "on a calm summer evening" an incorrect answer.

QUESTION 3

Travelers should check passport and visa requirements with consular officials of the countries to be visited well in advance of their departure date. Application for a passport may be made at a passport agency, many federal and state courts, probate courts, some county and municipal offices, and some post offices. The 14 major cities with U.S. passport agencies are Boston, Chicago, Denver, Honolulu, Houston, Los Angeles, Miami, New Orleans, New York, Norwalk, Connecticut, Philadelphia, San Francisco, Seattle, and Washington DC. 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According to the above passage, which of these offices is the least likely to issue a passport?

Correct Answer: B

QUESTION 4

On June 22, 1944, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt signed into law one of the most significant pieces of legislation ever produced by the United States government: The Service members' Readjustment Act of 1944, commonly known as the GI Bill of Rights. By the time the original GI Bill ended in July 1956, 7.8 million World War II veterans had participated in an education or training program, and 2.4 million veterans had home loans backed by the Veterans Administration (VA).

The G.I. Bill provided _____.

- A. free housing, training, and education
- B. medical coverage, education, and assistance to veterans
- C. home loan guarantees, training, and education for many former military members
- D. a means to exempt veterans from social security taxes



Correct Answer: C

Explanation:

According to the passage millions of veterans received home loan guarantees, education, and training, making Choice "home loan guarantees, training, and education for many former military members" the correct answer.

Be careful here, as Choice "free housing, training, and education" is tempting, but nothing in the passage indicates that the housing, education, and training were totally free.

QUESTION 5

There was once a dog who used to snap at people and bite them without any provocation, and who was a great nuisance to everyone who came to his master's house. So his master fastened a bell round his neck to warn people of his presence. The dog was very proud of the bell, and strutted about tinkling it with immense satisfaction. But an old dog came up to him and said, "The fewer airs you give yourself the better, my friend. You don't think, do you, that your bell was given to you as a reward of merit? On the contrary, it is a badge of disgrace."
