QUESTION 4

A cavity containing pus surrounded by inflamed tissue is _____.

- A. cellulitis
- B. an abscess

Correct Answer: B

A cavity containing pus surrounded by inflamed tissue is an abscess. An abscess is typically formed as a result of suppuration in a localized infection.

Cellulitis is an infection of the skin characterized by heat, pain, erythema, and edema.

Extravasation is the passage, or escape of blood, serum, or lymph fluids into the tissues.

A band of scar tissue that binds together two surfaces that are typically separated is an adhesion.

QUESTION 5

Which intervention should the nurse take first to assist a woman who states that she feels incompetent as the mother of a teenage daughter?

- A. Recommend that she discipline her daughter more strictly and consistently.
- B. Make a list of things her husband can do to help her improve.
- C. Assist the mother to identify what she believes is preventing her success and what she can do to improve.
- D. Explore with the mother what the daughter can do to improve her behavior.

Correct Answer: C

The intervention priority with a mother who feels incompetent to parent a teenage daughter is to assist the mother to identify what she feels her crisis events are and to help her develop better coping skills and improve her mothering skills. With a teenager, the growth and development parameters have to be concentrated on self as well as acquiring an added event. Choices "Recommend that she discipline her daughter more strictly and consistently.", "Make a list of things her husband can do to help her improve." and "Explore with the mother what the daughter can do to improve her behavior." do not directly address the mother's feelings of inadequacy.
