The median effective dose of a drug, or ED50, is the dosage that will be effective for 50% of the



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population.

This is used as a benchmark when deciding on prescription strengths.

QUESTION 4

Which of these is most important when dealing with medical records?

- C. Legibility
- D. Availability

Correct Answer: B

All of these elements are important, but when dealing with medical records confidentiality is paramount. Always make sure that records are not being disclosed to an unauthorized entity, and check with the office handbook and other staff when in doubt.
