Correct Answer: C

This sentence has an error by using an inappropriate conjunction (for) while two contrast ideas are spoken.



When contrast statements take place the conjunction should help them to differentiate each other as in the option "across nation, but no one can match our quality" the conjunction (but) does.

Other options use inappropriate conjunctions such as for/and/nor.

Correct Answer: C
